In Yorkshire there are hundreds of different animals and most of them have caring owners who love them and care for them. However, some animals are living on the streets and have to find their own food for their family (foxes).

Yorkshire has many places where animals go if they are found on the streets, such as the RSPCA(Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals) where they can live safely until they are rehoused

Animals come in all shapes and sizes. Some hunt each other and are called predators and if the predator hunts another animal the animal they hunt is called prey.

Common Animals.

Foxes live across the whole of Yorkshire - even in peoples back gardens! They love to find food out of bins like leftovers, and meat that people throw away - but if the foxes do not get any food for a certain amount of time they shall die. Some foxes have a family and need to hunt for them so there family doesn't starve, mostly male foxes do that.

Dogs can be found anywhere in Yorkshire, but are different to foxes. Unlike foxes, dogs do have homes and live with people who are known as <u>owners</u>. Dog owners have to provide dog food for their dogs and may buy another pet dog so the first doesn't get lonely. You must buy a dog license to be able to own a dog.

Dogs are great for co-operating. Unfortunately some people are blind, and need a dog to lead them round the streets and cross over the streets safely and to lead them home.

Cats are also common in Yorkshire and have homes but they love to wander the streets. Cats are predators: they hunt mice and rats.


Rare Animals.

Hedgehogs are rare although they used to be common! Unfortunately they keep on getting hit by cars and hunted down.

Frogs are also rare they live near ponds and in them. They like to hide in long grass and come in many different colours.

Recently a wild bird called a red kite has increased in numbers across Yorkshire. The kites are magnificent birds of prey and have been bred in woodland north of Leeds – right next to the set of a very famous Yorkshire Television set: EMMERDALE FARM!

Yorkshire Animals Information sheet

In Yorkshire there are many different animals in all sorts of different shapes and sizes: some you may have as pets, some not. I will show you some of the common animals here in Yorkshire.

Common Animals

<u>Foxes:</u> These nocturnal animals are really common here in Yorkshire but they will soon be extinct due to cars hitting them (road kill) and hunters hunting tem for their skin only to sell the skins for money.

<u>Hedgehogs</u>: These also are nocturnal creatures and are harmless unless frightened or stunned. These are counted as pets but not many people buy them because they can harm children with their spikes.









<u>Dogs</u>: These are the most purchased animal in the UK and are extremely popular. Dogs are also related to wolves.

<u>Cats:</u> Cats [just like dogs] are also very popular in the UK but some are catnapped and some are simply abandoned on the streets.

<u>Frogs:</u> Frogs are very popular in the UK. They are commonly found near wet damp areas near ponds, rivers and also streams.
